But looking back at our March gatherings it is a huge pleasure to report great presentations, good attendances and fulsome discussions. We served a splendid supper and an afternoon tea – a special thank you to Helen Wilson, Clare Gleeson and Heather MacFarlane.

The evening with Heritage NZ was presented by Jamie Jacobs, Area Manager, Alison Dangerfield, Central Area Manager and architect, and archeologist and senior planner, Joanna Barnes-Wylie. It was a longer evening than usual as there was much content to cover, including aspects of the controversial WCC Spatial Plan. The extended conversation continued over supper. The consensus was "a great evening" and a wish to meet with Heritage NZ more often.

Joanna screened the list of buildings, areas and sites in our area and has since forwarded this for our publication, titled: **Listed heritage buildings and scheduled places, 2021**, see pages 4, 5 and 6. Also, using this information we have an opportunity to conceive how identified heritage buildings and areas could be a useful tool for city planners, they could blend them with the proposed densified housing areas into well designed landscapes for the best future environment. With your input we could produce concept plans and put a proposal to Council.

We did it many decades ago and achieved the Tarikaka Street Settlement that we have today, we can do it again!

Loretta Lander – a friend we will miss

It was with great sadness I heard that Loretta had died on 20 March 2021.

She had been a close, personal friend and although she had been unwell for a long time, her death was unexpected. She was a member of OHS for many years and a

milestone was her research and writing the edition of *The Onslow Historian*, titled *Three Decades in Woodmancote Road, 1930–1960*, Volume 37, 2008.

In another historical endeavor, in 2005, she researched and wrote *Twenty years of Opera in Wellington: 1973–1992*, published by

Crescendo, the Bulletin of the International Association of Music Libraries (New Zealand Branch).

Loretta and her partner, David Beattie were regular attendees at OHS functions. They initiated and contributed to events in their special ways, particularly when musical input was required. They were always generous, and worked collegially with our volunteers and the programmes we initiated. Last year they hosted us at their home in Woodmancote Road, Khandallah, to a full-house performance of a silent movie screening of *The Toll of the Sea*, 1922, the story of *Madam Butterfly*. David performed the piano accompaniment compiled to his personal selection of musical scores.

Old memories go back to the days when we still had the original 1840's portable organ, rescued from the old Johnsonville Methodist Church, at KATE. David repaired it to a point that it could be played (a miracle!) and he and Loretta provided a number of performances with sing-alongs at our Christmas parties.

A fitting musical goodbye service for Loretta was held on 26 March 2021; and OHS was well represented.

We will miss you Loretta.

The Foothills Route : the history of the Wellington Urban Motorway, 1966–1976

Wednesday 21 April 2021 at K.A.T.E. – 7.30 for a 7.45pm start

I was at a Wellington Early Settlers' function when I first saw this remarkable presentation. Gabor has assembled the history and photography of one of Wellington's major landscape alterations that saw the demolition of most of our first city suburb of the 1840s, including the historic Bolton Street Cemetery.

One of the largest and most complex works of infrastructure development in Wellington's history, this talk uncovers the history of the Wellington motorway, the thinking behind its design and the controversy surrounding its construction. The talk is primarily based around a set of photographs commissioned by the Ministry of Works documenting the building of motorway over a 10-year period.

You won't want to miss this event. An historical change to Wellington city that has affected all of us.
